Dear St. James Family,

Easter greetings of new and abundant life!

For the past 117 years, St. James has been known as the neighbourhood church. Our caring, loving, hard-working, community-minded congregation has always opened our doors, shared our space, and found meaning and growth in learning from others. We were an affirming church from the get-go!

Our congregation is tremendous at thinking outside the box - offering worship, church school, guides, brownies, scouts, hockey and softball, food at the Peterborough Exhibition, starting the very first Breakfast Program in Peterborough, offering community theatre for over 50 years, and the list goes on. Being able to offer a safe, loving and welcoming space to all who come through the doors, has always been of paramount importance to us.

Fifteen years ago, we decided that we wanted to share our space in a more intentional, long-term way. The New Canadians Centre were near neighbours, their services and staff were growing and our values aligned beautifully.

Our partnership began back in 2010, with the Thursday morning NCC's Women's Group gathering in the St. James kitchen – cooking together and creating friendships. Over the next few years, we negotiated a long-term rental agreement with the NCC and have enjoyed and appreciated sharing our building, forging relationships, nurturing our partnership, and being a positive space for new Canadians.

All these years later and after tremendous prayerful consideration, our congregation is ready to become a tenant instead of a landlord. While this decision comes with sadness and feelings of loss and uncertainty, we are also grateful and excited to hand over the reigns of building ownership to the New Canadians Centre. We look forward to not being responsible for building and property costs and upkeep. We look forward to remaining in the building and focusing on our life and ministry, and where the Spirit is leading us. We look forward to nurturing and growing our community partnerships and ever dreaming big about what opportunities might lie ahead for us as a community of faith.

During this Easter Season, I leave you with these fitting and meaningful words from verse two of the beloved hymn, In the Bulb There Is a Flower.

There's a song in every silence, seeking word and melody, there's a dawn in every darkness, bringing hope to you and me. From the past will come the future; what it holds, a mystery, unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

This is our time for hope and joy - for we know God goes with us on this great new adventure. We have so much to celebrate and to look forward to. Thanks be to God for this opportunity!

TREASURER'S UPDATE

Happy Easter to all of you.

As we move into Spring, another very successful Stewardship campaign is in the books. The committee asked the congregation to help raise \$3500 towards the January snowplowing bill. The response was not surprising! Once again, you not only met, but exceeded the goal. Our members donated \$4236 and with additional contributions by the Tuesday Morning Craft Club and Fyd-I-Styx, our grand total was \$4786. Thank you to all who were able to help with this campaign.

The first three months of the year are expensive ones with high utility and snowplowing bills. This year we have a \$47,500 deficit (to March 31) compared to our budget. We experienced a harsh winter resulting in snowplowing costs of more than \$30000 and utility costs of approximately \$20,000. As a result, we have had to redeem a \$25000 GIC. While these expenses will end for us as we move forward in our role as tenant rather than owner, so too will the income received through room rentals. We will receive a monthly mortgage payment of \$6000 from the NCC (\$5460 to St. James, \$540 to ECORC) however when added to our monthly donations, we will need to generate income through various campaigns and events to cover our monthly expenses. We will continue to rely on your contributions to meet our obligations.

One easy way for you to help us budget for the year is to sign up for PAR (pre-authorised remittance) if you have not already done so. We have experienced two Sundays this winter when the service had to be cancelled due to weather. Donations decreased because the collection plates were not passed. Historically, revenues drop significantly during the summer months. Not only do PAR donations make bookkeeping easier, but, most importantly, they guarantee that we will receive consistent contributions each month.

Your donations are always appreciated, no matter the amount.

Now that we are officially tenants at 221 Romaine Street and are no longer responsible for caring for the building and grounds, we take this opportunity to thank the Stewards for being amazing caretakers of the property.

For the past 117 years the Board of Stewards has faithfully served St. James in countless ways. They have cared for the building with the same love and devotion they have cared for their own homes. Many of them have been in parts of this building that the rest of us don't even know exist – nooks and cranny's – some filled with creepy crawlies, bats, birds or mice. They have responded to calls in the middle of the night from Georgian Bay (the security company), they've been at the church early mornings, evenings, weekends and holidays to respond to emergencies such as a leaking roof, flooding from a backed-up sewer, power outages, and the list goes on.

Many of them have been on tall ladders painting, making repairs and hanging things. They researched and hired kind, trustworthy experts to care for and improve parts of the building and property. These professionals have become friends to St. James.

They offered support and affirmation to the Treasurer in the days before we had a Finance Team.

Two individuals who have served as chairs for extended periods of time are still very active at St. James. Dale White, thank you for your many years of dedication, leadership and hard work. You went above and beyond in so many ways, and it was greatly appreciated! I know this was a position of importance for your family as both your dad and grandfather served as chairs of the Board of Stewards.

Kate (Ellis) thank you for your service these past 8 years. There seems to be no limit to what you have been willing to do for St. James and we appreciate your countless hours of dedication to this building, as well as your expertise in all things mechanical, and your eager willingness to learn and master so many new things along the way. Every room in this building has been improved in some small or large way because of you - and most of it was done behind the scenes.


