## AN UPDATE FROM YOUR TREASURER

The following is an update on your church's financial situation as of August 31, 2022.

Our overall revenues are down considerably (about \$50,000) compared to the first eight months of 2021. This is due primarily to our envelope givings being reduced by about that amount. PAR givings are the same for both years. Also, the government wage subsidies ended in June 2022, whereas in 2021 they were available all year.

Fortunately, while our overall expenses are higher than they were YTD in 2021, they are under budget year-to-date. Canada's high inflation has had some effect on us, just like everyone else.

Our YTD deficit was reduced over the summer months, from about \$28,000 as of the end of July to \$20,000 at the end of August. With everyone's help over the next four months, we hope (and need) to eliminate that deficit by December 31.

Over the past couple of years, our general fund has had to borrow money from our savings account to help cover our expenses at a time of reduced revenues. In addition, several GICs from our reserve funds have been cashed for the same purpose and should be replaced at some point. We have also been using our line of credit at the bank regularly. As of August 31, to pay off our line of credit, repay the savings account, and buy back the GICs that were cashed, we need almost \$40,000. This is in addition to the \$20,000 required to balance our current revenues with our expenses.

How can you help? If you are not donating on a weekly or monthly basis, please consider doing so as we have consistent, ongoing expenses and bills to pay, just like we do in our homes. In addition, I encourage you to support any fundraisers the church or UCW have and to buy gift cards from Jim Lowes monthly (either for someone else or for you to use yourself at your grocery store, gas bar, hardware store, restaurant, etc.); every gift card bought generates revenue for St. James. October 30th we will be celebrating our 114th anniversary and you are invited again this year to donate a dollar for each year we have been able to celebrate being a church family. Every dollar of revenue helps us remain a viable and important part of our community.

A reminder: there is a copy of our latest financial statement posted in the hallway of the church for anyone to view. If you have any questions about it, please see me.

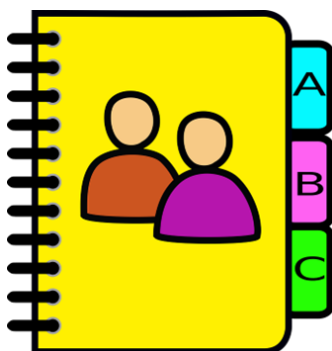
## Come join the Craft Group!

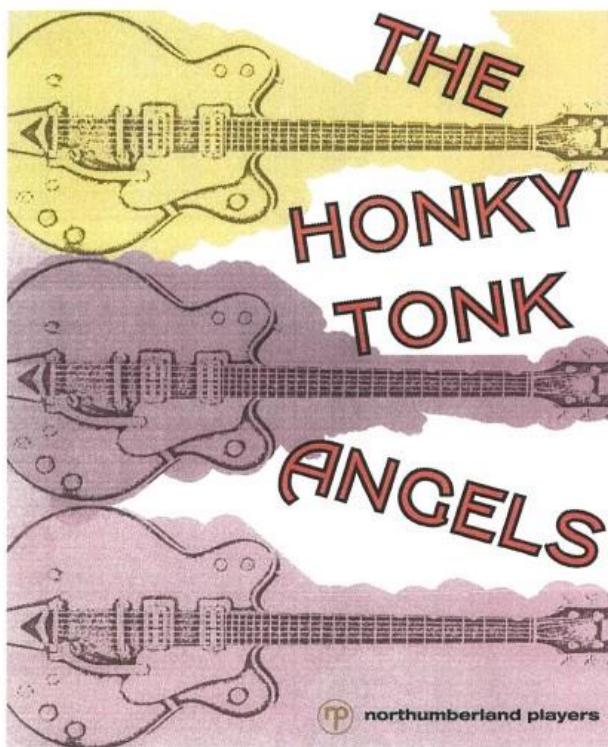
# Fundraising Committee
